

## 16 by 16 A new award scheme which rewards everything YOU do in and out of school

### What is 16 by 16?

- It is an award scheme that rewards the 'All-Round' student.
- There are 16 targets to be achieved
- If you meet four of the targets in your five years at Saint Aidan's you will be awarded a Bronze Award
- If you meet nine of the targets in your five years at Saint Aidan's you will be awarded a Silver Award
- If you meet all sixteen of the targets in your five years at Saint Aidan's you will be awarded a Gold Award
- Some targets can be achieved straight away, some over all five years

### Why is this Important?

- Sixth Form Colleges, Universities and Employers are all looking for individuals who contribute to all aspects of school life and in all areas of society as well as having a series of high GCSE grades and other awards
- Having some of these awards demonstrates to these groups that the school has recognised your 'all-round' contribution
- You will have an 'official' certificate to be used as part of your CV

### What are the 16 Targets?

- Take part in at least two different extra-curricular activities.
- Achieve over 95% attendance over a year.
- Read at least five of the books on the Reading Challenge.
- Take part in a School visit.
- Take an active part in an event to raise money for charity which has been organised by yourself or someone else.
- Lead Form worship.
- Organise an event to raise money for charity.
- Represent the School at a public event.
- Visit the theatre, an art gallery or a museum and write a short review of what you have learnt.
- Complete at least 10 hours of voluntary service.
- Complete at least 30 hours of voluntary service.
- Lead a regular activity or club for younger students over a period of at least half a term.

- Make a successful presentation or performance to a large audience (more than a class)
- Achieve at least the “Silver Award” in a school year
- Be successful in an application for a position of responsibility in School and carry it out effectively.
- Achieve a qualification which will help you to help others- for example, in First Aid, life saving or sports leadership.

#### How do I start to work towards achieving these awards?

- Your form tutor will have a record form for each student which they will keep in their form tutor folder
- You have to go to your form tutor with supporting evidence that you have reached a target
- E.g. target = Achieve a qualification which will help you to help others- for example, in First Aid, life saving or sports leadership – Evidence = bring in your NGB Certificate for your form tutor to see
- Your form tutor will then sign and date the record form for you
- You can then talk to your form tutor about the next statement you can target
- When you have achieved four targets your form tutor will e-mail Mr. Armfield who will collate the information and a Bronze Certificate and Badge will be awarded and given at a House assembly
- When you have achieved nine targets your form tutor will e-mail Mr. Armfield who will collate the information and a Silver Certificate and Badge will be awarded and given at House assembly
- When you have achieved all sixteen targets your form tutor will e-mail Mr. Armfield who will collate the information and a Gold Certificate and Badge will be awarded and given at one of our presentation evenings or at a full school assembly

#### Using your Planner

- Your student planner has all the necessary information you need regarding the 16 x 16 Award scheme on page
- You can look at your planner and start to collate evidence from today
- Once you have achieved a target see your form tutor with the necessary evidence
- Telling your form tutor you have achieved the target is not good enough
- Cross this off your list in your planner and start to work towards the next target
